

The Advantages for Quakers of Accreditation as a Living Wage Employer



Accreditation provides a way of witnessing to a wider community that we are committed to payment of a Living Wage that pays enough to live on. It supports our testimony to equality and economic justice. The visual signs of witness will be that:

- The Area Meeting, School, Quaker centre or business will be shown on the Living Wage Foundation's website as accredited so anyone visiting it will see the commitment
- You will be sent a plaque to display so that visitors and users of a Meeting House, School, Quaker centre or business can see your commitment
- You will be entitled to use the Living Wage Logo on letters and literature

Accreditation demonstrates Friends commitment not only to pay the Living Wage currently but to pay it in future years.

If we are campaigning for payment of the Living Wage by others in our local community then to have the Area Meeting accredited gives credibility to that campaign.

The accreditation cost for an organisation employing less than 10 people is £50 a year.
